PARISH OF CRAILING.

CRAILING AND NISBET CHURCHYARDS.

Regulations for Interments adopted by Heritors on 4th October 1895.

- I. Heritors and Parishioners only have the right of interment in these Churchyards. But the Heritors extend the privilege to:—(1) A husband whose wife is buried in the Churchyard. (2) A wife whose husband is buried in the Churchyard. (3) Unmarried sons and daughters whose parents, one or both, are buried in the Churchyard. In all cases of doubt the Heritors' Clerk shall be guided by the Minister and Kirk-Session.
- II. A Plan of the Churchyard and a Register of Interments shall lie in the hands of the Heritors' Clerk, and the latter shall be submitted to the Heritors at their stated half yearly meetings.
- III. Any person desiring to have a grave opened shall supply the following particulars to the Heritors' Clerk:—The name, residence, age, and occupation of the deceased; the date of death; also relation of deceased to head of family in whose ground interment is to take place. These particulars shall be inserted by the Clerk in the Register of Interments, as also the number of the grave and its depth.
- IV. The Heritors' Clerk, on being informed of the above particulars, and receiving payment of the fees for digging the grave, according to the table of fees hereto appended, shall grant receipt for the same.
- V. Every grave must be to a minimum depth of 5 feet. All human remains discovered in digging shall be re-interred in the bottom of the grave.
- VI. No tombstone, corner stone, railing or other enclosure shall be erected without the consent of the Heritors, who shall always require to have before them either a plan, or a distinct description of what is proposed to be erected, and also if desired, a copy of the inscription to be placed thereon.

When casing is necessary an additional fee of 1s will be charged.

The above charges include digging out, filling in, pressing, and properly finishing a grave to the level, all mounding over graves being specially prohibited.

For non-parishioners an extra charge of 4s shall be paid to the Heritors' Clerk.
